

Virtual Whiteboard Apps:

These apps allow you to quickly record demos of problems and post them to the web for your students. I haven't found a better way to quickly answer student questions without being in the same room.

Educreations: (free) This is my current favorite. The one downside is that you can't yet export your videos.

Showme: (free) The first of these programs I tried. Good community, but you can only write on one screen, which is sometimes tough for longer problems

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ScreenChomp: (free) A good virtual whiteboard for long problems because you can scroll down a screen as you write. The big disadvantage is that there is no repository (one place on the web) where you can see all your demos together.
